OVERVIEW

Many of Europe's finest landscapes and best biodiversity is found in areas where there has been a long tradition of extensive livestock grazing or 'pastoral' farming. The decline or demise of many of these farming systems in recent years poses a serious threat to many of these landscapes and the communities within them. So what do these 'high nature value' farmed landscapes look like, where are they, what needs to be done to sustain them and the farming communities that are so integral to their future?

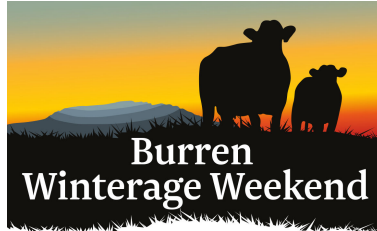
